The Tea Tag

Step 1. Cut or find an 8.5" X 11" piece of paper. An 8.5" X 11" book can be used as a cutting guide. The tags on this page were created using gift wrapping paper.

Step 2. Fold the short-side of the paper in three.

Step 3. Fold the long-size of the paper by using the cardboard tea guide (2.75" X 3.125").

Step 4. Fold the short-side of the paper in three, tucking one side into the opposing side.

Step 5. Dog-ear the top of the long-side of the paper and tuck it into the bottom, leaving enough room to write the "to" and "from" for the gift tag.

Step 6. Insert the tea bag into the front.

A tea tag ornament can be created by punching a hole in the tag. The tea tags on this page have two holes punched for the string.





The Tea Tag

Step 1.

Cut or find an 8.5" X 11" piece of paper to use for this project. An 8.5" X 11" book can be used as a cutting guide. The tags on this page were created using gift wrapping paper. The tags shown at the end of this project were created by using precut 8.5" X 11" mulberry paper (a blend) and Japanese paper.



Step 2.

Use a guide to fold the short-side of the paper in three. The guide should be 1/3 of the paper size on the short-side and a little larger than your tea bag on the long-side.

The tea tag pictured is approximately 2.75" X 3.125". Marking the tea tag guide with an arrow will help you orient the guide when folding the paper.

Step 3.

Fold the long-size of the paper once by using the cardboard tea guide.



Step 4.

Fold the short-side of the paper in three, tucking one side into the opposing side.

Step 5.

Dog-ear the top of the long-side of the paper and tuck it into the bottom, leaving enough room to write the "to" and "from" for the gift tag.



Step 6.

Insert the tea bag into the front.

A tea tag ornament can be created by punching a hole in the tag. The tea tags on this page have two holes punched for the string.
